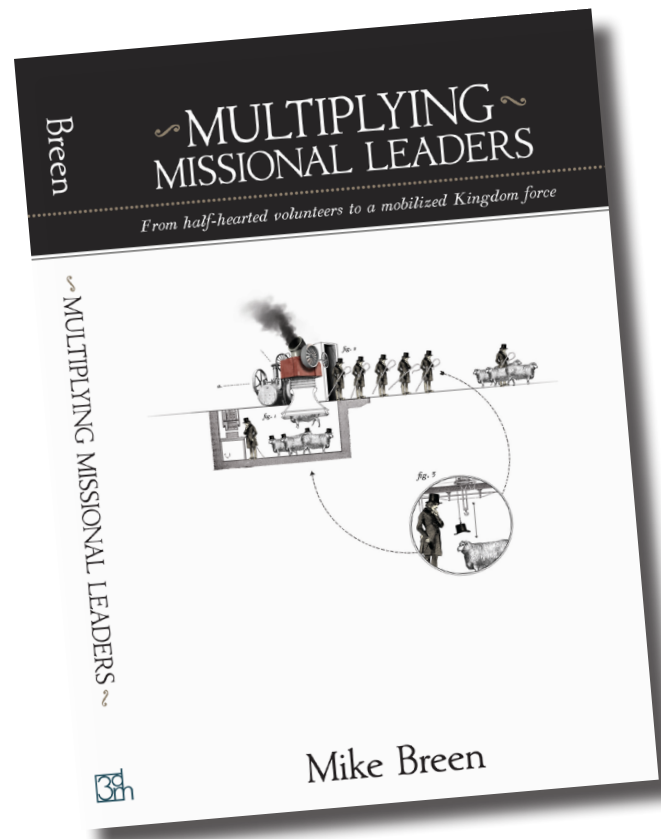

TO A MISSIONAL MOVEMENT

YOU DON'T GET A MISSIONAL MOVEMENT WITHOUT MISSIONAL LEADERS

1 WHAT IS A MISSIONAL LEADER?

Someone who mobilizes God's people to join his redemptive work in the world. Effective missional leaders can mobilize and lead at least 20-50 people (about the size of an extended family). It's not that small groups of people can't be effective in mission; it's that most often mission is difficult to sustain with groups of that size. A group of 20-50 is "small enough to care, but large enough to dare." If you can't consistently and intentionally multiply leaders with this capacity, you don't have a movement on your hands.

2 HOW DO YOU FIND MISSIONAL LEADERS?

Use these filters to determine if someone has the potential to be a missional leader:

CHARACTER: Do they have the interior life needed by someone going to the missional frontier, or at least the desire to develop it? Do they hear from God and respond in obedience? Follow through? Do the right thing when no one's watching?

CAPACITY: Do they have the available time in their current season of life to lead something? Are they physically and emotionally healthy? How do they react under stress?

CHEMISTRY: Do you like them? Do others like them and enjoy working with them? Do you want to go to battle with them and be down in the trenches with them when the pressure is on?

CALLING: Are they called to this specific work at this specific time?

3 WHAT DO MISSIONAL LEADERS LEAD?

Many leaders use a vehicle called **MISSIONAL COMMUNITY**, which is a group of 20-50 people who exist to reach a particular neighborhood or network of relationships. They are networked together within a larger church community, allowing for a scattered and gathered church.

4 WHAT DO I LOOK FOR IN LEADERS?

Don't be star-struck by the ultra-talented, charismatic person. Dig deeper. Do they have the character **and** capacity to produce real kingdom fruit? Look for people who have the capacity to become leaders with **HIGH CHARACTER and HIGH COMPETENCY**.
